# **Arriving in Toronto**

### **Toronto Pearson International Airport (YYZ)**

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

Toronto Pearson International Airport is located about 22 km northwest of downtown Toronto and is Canada's largest airport. It is serviced by over 65 airlines, including **Air Canada**, **American Airlines**, **Delta**, **United**, **US Airways**, and **WestJet**. Pearson offers a variety of ways to travel to downtown Toronto, including the **Union Pearson Express**, **taxi services**, and the **Toronto Transit Commission (TTC)**. #### THE UNION PEARSON EXPRESS

The **Union Pearson Express** train (**UP Express**) is a convenient and affordable way to travel directly from Pearson Airport to Union Station in downtown Toronto in **25 minutes**. The UP Express costs **\$12.35 per one-way ticket** and departs from the airport every 15 minutes. Tickets can be purchased online at upexpress.com, service counters or ticket vending machines. #### TAXIS, LIMOUSINES, AND RIDE SHARES

A **taxi** or **limousine** can drive you from Pearson to downtown Toronto for about **\$65**. Traffic and construction can be unpredictable, so the trip can take from **25 to 70 minutes** depending on the time of day. To take a taxi or limousine, go to one of the following designated pick-up locations:

#### TERMINAL 1: Taxicabs: Door D or Limousines: Door C

#### **TERMINAL 3:** Taxicabs: Doors D, E & F or Limousines: Door F

Licensed ride share providers such as **Uber** or **Lyft** can take you from Pearson to downtown Toronto. Prices will vary depending on when you request your ride.

#### TERMINAL 1: Uber and Lyft: Ground Level - Door Q or P Uber Black and Lyft Lux: Door A

#### □ TERMINAL 3: Uber and Lyft: Arrivals Level - Door D, outer curb Uber Black and Lyft Lux: Door A

#### AIRPORT EXPRESS - TORONTO TRANSIT COMMISSION (TTC)

Use the TTC and take the **900 Airport Express** bus from Pearson to Kipling subway station for **\$3.35**. At Kipling, hop on the **Bloor-Danforth** subway heading east toward St. George. Transfer at St. George to the **Yonge-University** subway heading south towards Union Station. Please allow at least **75 minutes** for this trip. Note: TTC Operators do not sell fares or carry change, so you must have a form of payment ready before you board a vehicle.



## **Billy Bishop Toronto City Airport (YTZ)**

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

Billy Bishop Toronto City Airport is located on the Toronto Islands, just a 5-minute ferry ride or pedestrian tunnel away from downtown Toronto. The airport is serviced primarily by regional airline **Porter Airlines** as well as a few **Air Canada** routes. Porter Airlines is a comfortable and reasonably priced regional airline with service from **New York**, **Boston**, **Chicago**, **Washington** and more. #### **COMPLIMENTARY SHUTTLE**

Billy Bishop offers a **complimentary shuttle bus** between the airport and downtown Toronto. Hop on the bus just outside the airport's mainland ferry terminal; the bus will drop you off just past York and Front Street in the center of downtown Toronto, close to Union Station. The trip takes **15 minutes** and buses leave the airport every **15 minutes**. #### TAXIS

If you'd like to take a taxi directly from Billy Bishop Airport to your final destination, they are available at the designated stands in front of the airport. Fares are standard, metered, non-negotiable and range from **\$8 to \$15 plus tip**.

## **Getting around Toronto**

#### TAKE THE TTC



The **TTC** (or the **Toronto Transit Commission**) is Toronto's public transit system made up of subways, buses, and streetcars. Pay **\$3.35 per one-way fare** or **\$13.50 for a day pass** (Presto Pass required and can be purchased at the Fare Vending Machines at all subway stations) to get just about anywhere in Toronto. There are two main subway lines: the **Yonge-University** line which runs from north to south and the **Bloor-Danforth** line which runs from east to west. The subway lines operate from 6 am (9 am on Sundays) until 1:30 am daily while streetcars and buses vary. Visit <u>www.ttc.ca</u> to view a map and plan your trip. #### **CABS AND UBER**

If you're willing to brave the traffic, hail a cab for a comfortable ride anywhere in the city. Cab fares are standard, metered, and non-negotiable.

#### WALKING AND BIKING

Toronto has a simple, grid-like layout and is a very walkable city. Alternatively, rent a bike from **Bike Share Toronto** stations across the city. Purchase a **24-Hour Access Pass for \$15** for **unlimited 90-minute bike trips** or pay as you go (**\$0.12/minute** for classic bikes or **\$0.20/minute** for e-bikes + **\$1 unlock fee**).
